Planet thwarts two thirds of missions (The Independent, 31st December 2003)

MARS has earned ---64--- as the Bermuda ---65--- of the ---66--- system for the number of spacecraft that have come to grief there.

---67--- the Soviet Union attempted to send a probe to the Red Planet in 1960, more than two thirds of all Mars missions have foundered. Of the 34 attempts on the planet, 21 have ended in ---68--- , while another four generated minuscule amounts of data before they, too were ---69---.

---70--- nine probes have completed their missions, and only three have landed successfully on the Martian surface. The most ---71--- failure was in September 1999 when Nasa's *Mars Climate Orbiter* burnt up in the atmosphere after approaching on the wrong trajectory.

An investigation into the disaster found that engineers had ---72--- by 60 miles, as one team had used imperial units which another had failed to convert into metric. The Russians have ---73--- to succeed in 19 tries. Their most recent attempt in 1996 ---74--- when the *Mars 96* mission crashlanded in the Pacific Ocean after failing even to reach Earth orbit.

Two Soviet landers, *Mars 3* and *Mars 6*, did reach the surface in 1973, but neither sent more than a few minutes of data before contact was lost.
