Dangling off the contraption was a foot-long wire with a stamp-sized piece of wafer-thin foil stuck on the end . « The base is a high capacity hard disk audio recording system with rechargeable battery. The strip of foil at the end of the wire is a combination microphone and photoelectric recharging cell. »

These foil-like, photocell microphones had been an enormous breakthrough a few years back. Now, a hard disk recorder could be affixed behind a lamp, for example, with its foil microphone moulded into the contour of the base and dyed to match. As long as the microphone was positioned such that it received a few hours of sunlight per day, the photo cells would keep recharging the system. Bugs like this one could listen indefinitely.
